Dear NYCAP Member:

Those past members who have been approaching us this past year wanting to help reorganize are urged to attend.

Make no mistake about it- we don't want a meeting that will turn into a gripe session. Come prepared to lead the organization, work in the organization, and reshape the organization. The present officers are tired of beating a dead horse. We will now either resuscitate it or bury it.
